



BOARDING MISSION STATEMENT

Our aim when looking after our boarders is to ensure that each individual is presented with a safe and happy environment in which to live. The staff attached to each House share the responsibility of looking out for the interests of every boy or girl in the House through acting as Tutors and undertaking house duties. The Tutors take a special interest in the welfare and academic performance of their tutees and all encourage a good work ethic. All House staff monitor the personal and social development of the boarders and encourage an atmosphere in which each pupil respects the needs of the other boarders. The Boarding House is the home to these pupils for large periods of their life; the Boarding House will respect the individual privacy of pupils, whilst incorporating them into a cohesive community. Everything possible is done to ensure that they feel secure and have an adult they can trust to turn to in time of need.
