



Wrekin Prep Guidance Notes on Optional Additional Charges 2026/2027

After School Clubs

We offer a range of After School Clubs, most of which are free of charge. However, there is a non-refundable charge for those clubs provided by outside agencies. These charges will either be paid direct to the provider or added to your school bill.

Breakfast & Tea Clubs

Breakfast - 7.30am until 8.15am – Cost £5.45 per session or £26.40 per week. Bookable in advance – at least 24 hours notice required.

Tea - This club is for Lower School pupils, from 4.50pm until 5.40pm, to include supervision and tea. Cost £9.95 per session.

Extra Maths Tuition

Educational Support is predominantly free. However, some extra individual and shared Maths sessions may be arranged, as required and discussed, and are charged at £16.45 (individual lessons) & £8.30 (shared lessons) per 30-minute session.

Music Department

The charge for individual music tuition is £31.46 (inc VAT) per lesson of 30 minutes. The number of lessons per year is 30. The exact number in a term will vary by one or two according to the length of the term. Further details are available from the Director of Music. If a pupil wishes to cease music tuition, half a term's notice must be given in writing, to the Director of Music. Grade Examination fees and associated books are also charged to parents where appropriate.

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

Individual, shared and group lessons can be arranged and are charged as follows:

Upper School – Individual £21.45, Shared £10.80 & group of 3 or more £7.20.

Lower School – Individual £16.40, Shared £8.25 & group of 3 or more £5.50.

Insurance

Parents are reminded that pupils' personal possessions are not covered by School insurance. You are recommended to check that they are covered by your home contents insurance or take out suitable cover.

School Uniform Shop

The uniform shop is run by School Shop Direct. Any purchases must be paid for at the time of purchase.

School Visits and Outings

Various visits and outings take place throughout the academic year. A letter is sent home before each outing, giving details of the trip, cost & requesting permission for your child/children to go on such outings. It is hoped that all children will attend these trips, as they form an important part of your child's overall learning.

Residential Trips

Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 – These trips take place during the Summer Term. A deposit is paid in advance, then the remaining balance is split between the Michaelmas and Lent Term bills.

It is School policy that pupils should not be eligible for residential trips if there are fee arrears at the time deposits are taken and numbers finalised.
