Subjects

Extended Project Qualification

Students are given a further opportunity to extend their own independent learning on a topic entirely of their own choosing via the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

With guidance from our academic staff, students embark on their own project, researching their chosen topic and producing a written report on their findings. They then present their research to an audience, and answer questions on it.



The EPQ is highly regarded at Wrekin, with support and guidance every step of the way. It holds significant merit for both university admissions and prospective employers, as it demonstrates a student's ability to complete independent learning and critical thinking. EPQs are also worth UCAS points and is an excellent way to demonstrate successful independent study and self-motivation.

Employability



Employability is at the heart of Wrekin College, helping students to access their chosen careers.

Our Business School is an integral part of our employability approach. It provides students studying Accounting, Business Studies, Economics and Psychology with a dedicated environment where they



can immerse themselves into the world of business. The whole school is also invited to experience guest lectures, life skill seminars and real world business challenges to help them with future careers.

Our weekly Academic Lecture series sees industry professionals as well as staff, pupils and Old Wrekinians talk to our students about a range of issues, including real-world knowledge about particular career paths.

There are plenty of Employability opportunities within school as well, including our Expresso enterprise. A group of students came up with the idea to open a coffee van which serves students. staff and visitors as well as appearing at various school events. The school gave the team the money to invest and Expresso is now a living business run entirely by Sixth Form students. Each year the responsibility for Expresso is passed to a new Sixth Form cohort, meaning generations of Wrekinians getting valuable real-world business experience.

Wrekin Exchange



Wrekin's Exchange programme offers students a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience education in a different country, and host an international student in return.

This unique experience creates lifelong memories and provides students with incomparable life experience in living and learning in another country, as well as providing valuable skills which both universities and employers are looking for.



The exchange programme at Wrekin caters for students in Years 11 and 12, providing opportunities for students to participate in exchanges with host schools in Australia, South Africa, India and Argentina. Taking place for Wrekinians from the middle of July to the end of August, their exchange counterparts come to the UK at various times of the year.









The way in which previous participants talk about their exchange experience and the benefits they so clearly accrue from their time abroad is the real testimony to the success of the programme. They not only make new friends but also begin to appreciate the wider world: geographically, educationally, socially and politically. It is an opportunity not to be missed!

Our **House**



Our Sixth Form students get the chance to experience living independently in preparation for life after Wrekin, in 'Our House'.

'Our House' is a property situated within the Wrekin campus, but detached from other residences, to give students a feeling of independence, while within the safety of the Wrekin campus with staff close by. The experience of staying in 'Our House' is designed to resemble the practicalities and realities of university residential living and house-share accommodation. Residential groups comprise a maximum of six students who live, cook, clean, study and relax together for a week.
